**Is the unit conceptual?** Is it focused on learning around big ideas of importance rather than disconnected facts?

**Is the unit significant?** Is it of interest and relevance to the students and does it connect to their world?

**Is the unit comprehensive?** Is there enough complexity to ensure that students spend their time in meaningful inquiry?

Does the unit provide scope for student interest and personal inquiries? Does it allow scope within the unit for students to follow their own interests and inquiries, for them to have agency over their learning?

Does the unit provide an opportunity for students to develop skills/dispositions that are enduring? Can skills and/or dispositions that are enduring be embedded and focused on as a part of the unit? (e.g. critical thinking, research, collaboration, empathy, analysis, open minded)

Does the unit provide scope for action, creativity and/or problem finding and solving? Does it promote opportunities for action creativity, and/or problem finding and solving?

**Does the unit have the SO WHAT?** Does it extend beyond student's prior knowledge and are students able to apply and use their learning in an authentic context?
